Avoid exaggerated or misleading content that detracts from factual discussions. Focus on meaningful, fact-driven exchanges.

8. Respect the Al Insights

Use the AI-generated scores to guide discussions, but do not rely solely on them. Engage with the data critically and thoughtfully.

9. Report Uncivil Behavior

If you encounter disrespectful or disruptive behavior, report it to the moderators. Help maintain a positive and constructive environment.

10. Avoid Self-Promotion

The forum is for sharing ideas, not for promoting personal agendas or content. Stick to discussions that contribute to the forum's mission.
